Grand Knight's Report

My Brother Knights,

Meeting Change notice: We will meet this month at the VFW in Manchaca, TX. This last minute change is occurring because our Church and Grace Hall will be closed for cleaning and painting. We will start at 7pm as usual.

By all accounts the July meeting was an event filled evening. The budget discussion and beginning of year planning often are some of the most contentious meetings simply because of the subject matter. I applaud you all for working through the issues as painful as that may have been. The officer's did have a meeting this month and we have amended the proposed budget that is attached to this newsletter. We will have a first vote on this budget at the August meeting, and a second vote at the September meeting. It is important that we begin operating under an approved budget.

In the future I would like to have most of the open discussions about new events, budgets and new items of business at the officer's meeting each month. The business meeting agenda will be limited whenever possible to the items discussed at

the prior officer's meeting.

Committee heads and members should plan to introduce any new discussions or proposals at the officer's meeting only and the officers and members in attendance will endeavor to finalize the issue and have a recommendation to bring to the council at the next meeting under new business. In this way we hope to limit the free form discussions at the council meeting and keep each item of business to about 5 minutes.

Committee heads are also welcome to submit their monthly reports to the newsletter and simply refer to the newsletter during the meeting rather than repeat what is printed at their allotted time. I would recommend a brief spoken summary of the report with most of the details left in the newsletter. Please consider this approach and use it when possible.

Obviously running our business meetings in this manner requires discipline and planning ahead. If you have something to say about a business item please do so quickly and succinctly realizing that 5 minutes can pass quite quickly and it is only fair to the others in the meeting that we get a quick summary of the opinions in the room. If others have said something you agree with there is no reason to "me too" their comments with your own, show your support at the vote. Once we have a good argument and counter-argument (if there is one) let us move to the vote quickly.

If it appears that an item will go beyond 5-10 minutes that is an indication that it needs further discussion at the next officer's meeting. So we will seek to table the discussion until then if we cannot come to a consensus quickly. All members are welcome at every officer's meeting so please attend if there is something being discussed that you want input on.

I believe if we can maintain this meeting style we will keep the meetings short, informative, and interesting for all of the membership and that this will lead to better attendance from the members.

August is another relatively slow month for the Council. But in no time September will be here and with it comes the new school year and before you know it the parish fair will be here as well. So let us have a productive and quick business meeting and set ourselves up well for the near future.
