

The Good of the Order Deacon John Pickwell

How often are we caught in our own humanness and fall into the trap of letting our anger overcome us? We are so well aware of the principles of our Knight of Columbus organization, especially, Charity. This is so easy to say, it just rolls right off our tongue, and we may even be able to recite verbatim what is said on the Knights website about Charity: "Our Catholic faith teaches us to "Love thy neighbor as thyself." Members of the Knights of Columbus show love for their neighbors by conducting food drives and donating the food to local soup kitchens and food pantries, by volunteering at Special Olympics, and by supporting, both spiritually and materially, mothers who choose life for their babies. Knights

recognize that our mission, and our faith in God, compels us to action. There is no better way to experience love and compassion than by helping those in need, a call we answer every day."

Reading this, I wonder, what does this mean . . . to me as a person, how am I impacted and changed, converted so to speak, into the man that Jesus calls me into? Being that disciple and, for that matter, being a knight means so much more than time spent as a member of the Knights. When we start parading out our "chevrons" of time served as a knight, we may have fallen into a trap.

What aspect in our life are we ready to give to God, Kairos, and leave this Chronos world behind. How are we going to work in the Kairos time, being a better disciple for Christ, bringing people to God, in thought, word and deed? This is our chance to begin our personal change into becoming a better version of ourselves.
