#### Good of the Order

2015 is fast approaching its end, but before the calendar year ends, our Liturgical year ends. These are a good reminders that all things created eventually come to a natural end; all things that is, except our souls. It is good for us to be reminded of our mortality and eternity so that we can take seriously how we live our short lives. We want to do so in a manner according to the teachings of Jesus so that our souls will enter heaven after our physical body dies. When our bodies are resurrected and "recreated" at the end of time to remain forever in eternity, our bodies will rejoin our souls and we will be in heaven.

On November 2, we celebrate All Souls Day, a day we set aside to remember and pray for those who have died; we pray that their souls be reposed in heaven. Yet, when one of our loved ones dies, we want to instantly canonize them saying things like

now s/he is at peace in heaven. Our theology teaches that most of us need a little cleansing after our lives on earth and before we begin living in heaven. This cleansing takes place in what the church calls purgatory; a safe place for our souls, since it on the way to heaven, but it is not yet heaven. We can think of purgatory kind of like getting to second base in a baseball game, we are not home yet, but we are on our way. The good thing for us when we get to second is that Jesus is the next batter and we can be confident that he will get an RBI.

Purgatory is a period in our journey where our souls are purified - refined like gold in a furnace, so that we can become worthy to stand in the presence of God. When I die, I do not want people to say he is in heaven now, because if people think I am in heaven, there is no reason to pray for me any longer, and believe me, I will need all the prayers I can get.
