Black Friday. Most of us have survived Black Friday 2015, a day that carries a lot of hype and attention. This day marks the beginning of frantic preparations for the secular "Happy Holidays". The more you buy the more money you save – doesn't matter that you buy what is not necessary or may never be used, but just consider the saving. How we get so wrapped up in secular materialism?
