### Good of the Order

*For I was hungry and you gave me food... Matthew* 25:35

The generous will be blessed, for they share their food with the poor. Proverbs 22:9

For the Good of the Order... As I am preparing this article, I am also preparing myself for a trip to Nicaragua to see the face of the poor and hope that in some little way may bring Christ's love to them by being present and with them, even if just briefly. I will be in Nicaragua on a mission trip with Food For The Poor from January 25 - 29. My preparations for this trip are more than just packing a suitcase; I must prepare myself emotionally, psychologically, and spiritually as well – I feel deep within me, a nervous excitement, a reluctance and at the same time an eagerness to go. A reluctance because I would prefer to stay home with my bride where I am comfortable; an eagerness because I feel drawn to come closer to the least of Christ's brethren.

Jesus tells us "This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:35). God loves us so much that he became one of us to save us and he calls us to be people who love like he does. We must love others enough to save them as he did – recall the story of the loaves and fishes (John 6:1-15) Jesus fed the people because they were hungry. The spiritual and corporal works of mercy are love put into action.

The first corporal work of mercy is to feed the hungry and that is the work I want to focus on in this article. St. James in his Epistle says: "If a brother or sister has...no food for the day, and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace, keep warm and eat well', but you do not give them the necessities of the body, what good is it? (James 2:15-16) To feed the hungry is not an option for the Christian. Jesus makes it clear that we must take care of others if we hope to get to heaven – read Matthew 25:31-46.

So what does "feed the hungry" look like practically, how can we feed the hungry? There are so many! One way is to give money on a monthly basis – doesn't have to be a lot – to support an organization that takes care of feeding the poor. There are many such organizations – I particularly like HEIFER INTERNATIONAL because they help the poor not only by providing food for the day, but also providing assistance and training so that one family at a time can pull itself out of poverty, and they require the family they help to then help a neighboring family by providing a product of their new source of income and mentoring to the family so they too can begin their own success story. I also like Food for the Poor because they too do more than just hand out food for the day, they work to improve the life of the poor by providing clean water sources, legitimate housing, and other important necessities for life we often take for granted. Catholic Relief Services and the Diocesan Services Appeal are also deserving of our consideration for donation that ultimately will help feed the hungry.

Other practical ways to feed the hungry include adopting a child in a foreign country, one organization through which you can do that is Compassion International. You can donate to a food bank, volunteer at a food pantry or an organization like CARITAS that feeds people. You can make sandwiches and take them to the homeless, an easy way to do this is to volunteer to help Mobile Loaves and Fishes here in Austin. You can carry change in your pocket or keep a little in the cup holder of your car and each time you meet a beggar, give him or her something, even if it is just a quarter and give them a smile as well. If you are reluctant to give them money because you are afraid they will use it to buy drugs or alcohol, keep \$5.00 McDonald's gift cards in your car and give them to the beggars so that they can get something to eat. There are many things you can do; you just have to do it.

So think about what you can do and then turn those thoughts into reality. God wants to use you for his glory. He wants to use you to reach out and feed others. Let God use you and start to change the world! And then be one who hears Jesus say: "Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food..." (Matthew 25:34-35)
