#### **Good of the Order**

For the Good of the Order...

It's here. Lent began just a few days ago on Ash Wednesday. During Lent we are asked to do three things: pray, fast, and give alms.

What is prayer, and how should we pray? Prayer is intimate communion and conversation with God. Judging from Jesus' own life, prayer is something that we ought to do often, especially at key moments of our lives.

How should we pray? Bishop Robert Barron says you have to pray with faith, and according to Jesus' model, you have to pray with forgiveness. The efficacy of prayer seems to depend on the reconciliation of differences. You also have to pray with persistence. One reason that we don't receive what we want through prayer is that we give up too easily. Augustine said that God sometimes delays in giving us what we want because he wants our hearts to expand. And we have to pray in Jesus' name. In doing so we are relying on his influence with the Father, trusting that the Father will listen to him.

When we think of fasting we often first think of being hungry or giving up something we like. But we can and should fast from those things that keep us from growing closer to God. What are those things? They can be a number of things, TV, for example, or being Martha, preoccupied with the daily chores and activities of life, things that leave us little or no time for prayer, Scripture reading, or spirital reflection.

I am not saying give up all TV or stop doing daily chores

or work, but I am suggesting we fast from TV and being Martha-like, and take the better as Mary did in choosing to listen to Jesus instead of staying in the kitchen as Martha. We still have to take care of daily responsibilities, but maybe we can refocus our priorities and fast from those activities long enough to give time to listen to Jesus in prayer and reflecting on Scripture. But don't forget the two church days of fasting – Ash Wednesday (now past) and Good Friday, days on which we are asked to truly fast from food and drink, although we can have one moderate meal and two smaller meals and water, but no snacks in between meals.

Finally, alms giving. All that we have comes from God; God blessed us with so many good things, but the gifts he gives to us are to be shared with those who did not receive as many gifts. While it is good for us to do what we can to be self-sufficient and take care of our families, we must also keep in mind what Jesus asks us to do: to love one another as he has loved us, and we do that by showing compassionate love and mercy to others, especially those most in need. In Matthew 25:40 Jesus said "whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me."

Recall the parable of the rich fool in Luke's gospel. The man had a bountiful harvest, so much so that his barns were not large enough to store all the produce, so he tore down the barns and built new bigger ones so he could store all his riches for himself, but before he could use any of what he had stored, he died.

So as we provide for our own needs and future through working, saving, investments, or whatever means, let us be careful not to be greedy. During this lent, make an effort to share some of your wealth with those less fortunate. Vivat Jesus
