Good of the Order

For the Good of the Order...

Brothers,

Bishop Thomas J. Olmsted, Bishop of Phoenix, in his booklet Into The Breach says: "The world is under attack by Satan, as our Lord said it would be (Peter 5:8-14). [see text at end of this article] This battle is occurring in the Church herself, and the devastation is all too evident. Since AD 2000, 14 million Catholics have left the faith, parish religious education of children has dropped by 24%, Catholic school attendance has dropped by 19%, infant baptism has dropped by 28%, adult baptism has dropped by 31%, and sacramental marriages have dropped by 41%. This is a serious breach, a gaping hole in Christ's battle lines." Bishop Olmsted's booklet is an apostolic exhortation to Catholic men which all of us should read and reread.

I believe much of this decline in Catholicism can be

attributed to diminished or perhaps even non-existent family prayer at home. It is time for us to step up and fill the breach in the battle line. As Knights, let's be reminded of Father McGivney's vision for family life, that not only each family might find financial and material aid, but also that holiness is the calling of all baptized Christians. As Catholic fathers and grandfathers, we must live the example of communicating the divine gift of love of the Gospel in the activities of our daily lives. And what better way of doing this than nourishing the domestic church of our own families.

The domestic church builds the universal Catholic Church, one family upon another like one brick upon another eventually builds a structure. If we do not provide strong bricks, then how can we expect Catholicism to remain strong in a culture that is so focused on materialism, instant gratification, and doing our will, not God's – remember, that is what got us in this mess in the first place, Adam and Eve doing their will (prompted by the devil) rather than God's.

How can we expect our children to know God's will if we do not help them know God? Sending them to Catholic school or religious education, and taking them to Mass is a good start but not enough. When we pray with our families, we invite Jesus into our homes and our family lives, and we build a strong domestic church. You have heard Father Gerold talk about the domestic church and a home prayer space or home altar. The Knights of Columbus encourage us to build the domestic church and provide a guide to make The Family Fully Alive. But Supreme and clergy can only encourage, we cannot make your family a domestic church, only you can make that happen, so I encourage you once again, if you have not already done so, to dedicate a prayer space, decorated with religious articles, in your home and begin praying with your family weekly, if not daily. And as soon as you can, ask one of the priests or deacons to come bless your prayer space, home altar, shrine, nook, or whatever you wish to call it. The most challenging will be getting started, so start small and be consistent and soon you will develop a habit of family spirituality. We know how easy it is to develop bad habits, let's work on developing a good one. We are currently celebrating the Risen Christ in this Easter Season, let's keep him alive in our hearts and in our homes.
