The Family Fully Alive – June – "Self-Giving Love"

The form of marital and family love is given by God himself, who is love. The Christian family, the domestic church, has been entrusted with the irreplaceable vocation of being the first school of human divine love. Family Project – An important part of love consists in doing things out of love for others, even things that we may find unpleasant. To encourage these little sacrifices, research and make sacrifice beads (also known as "good deed beads"), inspired by a practice that St. Therese of the Child Jesus used to do when she was a child. Sacrifice beads are essentially a way of helping the family look for opportunities to make little offerings of love to God through small acts of self-giving service.

Good of the Order...

Brothers,

This probably will not come as a surprise to many of you – I like golf. I enjoy watching golf tournaments on TV, and once when I was traveling in California, I listened to the play-by-play of a PGA tournament on the radio, making my drive from the airport to my destination quite enjoyable. I have never found golf on the radio since then, so perhaps only few people listen. I like to play golf too. I am not all that good, but I enjoy trying to play better than the last time, and I always enjoy playing in charity golf tournaments, like the one we sponsor each year.

I have been thinking about how golf and life are similar. When you play golf, you know what you should do to play well, you follow a plan, so to speak, and you follow the rules of the game. You don't always know, and if you play like me rarely do you know, where your ball will stop after you hit it. Regardless where it stops, the rules require you to play the ball as it lies, or if it is not playable – maybe you hit it out of bounds or into the water - you a have to take a penalty and continue to play the game. But when you play in a charity golf tournament, you have the option to buy mulligans before the tournament begins. I like mulligans. Mulligans give you another chance if you mess up your shot. When you take a mulligan, you can ignore the bad shot – put it out of your mind as if it never happened – and you take the shot again, no penalty. In other words, you have a second chance.

In life we also know what we need to do to live well and according to God's plan. We live life as it comes. What we do today, may not turn out as we thought it would, but we live with the consequences of our choices and actions – we play life as it lies. Like golf, God's plan has a few rules – in the Old Testament there were 613 rules, 10 of which are the Ten Commandments. Those rules were not given to us because God wanted to make the game hard for us, unlike golf, where it seems the rules main purposes are to make the game more difficult. Why can't I pick up the ball and move it out from behind a tree so I can have a clear

shot? While the golf rules seem to get us in trouble, God's rules give us guidance on how to stay out of trouble.

But I want to reflect on the mulligan part a little bit more. Mulligans are good in golf because you can use a mulligan to redo a bad shot and the one before doesn't count – it is like it never happened. Wouldn't it be great if we had mulligans in life? When we make a mistake – "a bad shot" - make a poor life choice, hurt someone by our words or actions, etc. we could take a mulligan and redo that part. Even though God's rules are to keep us out of trouble, God knew that we would sometimes break one or more of the rules and would end up in trouble, so he did give us mulligans, an unlimited amount and we do not have to buy them. All we have to do is go to confession and ask for his forgiveness and as far as God is concerned, once we have confessed, we never made that mistake. We can move on trying to not make that same mistake again; but if we do, Jesus is there ready to give us another mulligan if we ask.

The only thing God's mulligans don't do is allow us and those we hurt to have the "bad shot" -- the mistake we made, the effect of the broken rule -- erased from our relational human life. We have to work on that part by asking those we hurt to forgive us, by forgiving those who hurt us by their offenses, and by forgiving ourselves so that we can move forward in life and end up with a respectable score in the end.
