

Witnessing to the Faith - Family Project

The 4th of July is just a few days away. As I reflect on the birthday of our nation and the freedoms we enjoy as a free nation, many thoughts run through my mind. I think of those who gave their lives so that we could be free. Some perhaps reluctantly because they were drafted into service and some freely, eagerly volunteering to serve our country to keep it free. Regardless, all those who served ultimately offered their life for others – Jesus said there is no greater love than to lay down your life for your friends. We will have a Mass at 10:00 AM on the 4th to close the Fortnight of Freedom which we have been keeping watch through prayer since June 21.
